


Reaching the Hotel and ELSI from the airports

From Narita International airport:




The train station is underground so take the escalators all the way down (see figure on the left). The layout for Terminal 1 is similar. Approach the JR ticket booth on your right and buy a ticket to Oimachi (大井町)

* There are two gates to station exit. Please remember to take your ticket after first gate.

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station using the Narita Express (this must be specified). Credit cards are accepted. Take the Narita Express from the airport to Shinagawa (品川) station. The trip is about 70 minutes. Make sure to catch the right one in the direction of Ofuna (大船) since others do not pass through Shinagawa station.




At Shinagawa station you arrive on platform 14 and need to switch trains to the Keihin-Tohoku (京浜東北) line on platform 4 in the direction of Ofuna. Disembark at the next station, which is Oimachi. Look at the map two pages down for a guide to walk to the hotel from the station.

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From Haneda airport (Tokyo International Airport):

It is possible to get to the hotel near Oimachi (大井町) station by train, but this is made complicated and expensive by having to transfer lines from different train operators. The easiest thing to do is to take a bus. The buses are operated by Keihin Kyuko bus (京浜急行バス) and leave approximately every 15 minutes from platform 4. The image below indicates where to buy tickets and where the buses stop. The timetable is online at <http://hnd-bus.com/route/oimachi.html>

The map below indicates how to walk there from Oimachi station.

Unfortunately all Japanese hotels have the annoying habit that one needs to pay the full cost upon checking in rather than when checking out. However, it is possible to request to pay only the first night with a credit card and then the remainder with funds dispensed by ELSI. Your per diem (hotel, meal and local transportation costs) will be reimbursed in cash upon arrival. Regrettably we cannot reimburse you through international wire transfers. It is easiest to use this to pay for the remaining nights at the hotel.



Getting to ELSI from Oimachi station.



There are two routes. The first is to take the Tokyu Oimachi (東急大井町線) line to Ookayama (大岡山) station and then walk 10 minutes to ELSI, which unfortunately is situated the farthest possible from said station on campus. Please refer to the map on the left. Google maps only shows ELSI's main (new) building. If you need to go to the second/old building, please refer to the rightmost map below.



The second option is to change trains at Hatanodai (旗の台) station on the Oimachi line and go to Ishikawadai (石川台) station on the Tokyu Ikegami line (東急池上線). From Ishikawadai station the walk is shorter and more pleasant. See map on the left.



This last map on the left indicates how to walk from ELSI 1 (new building) to ELSI 2 (old building).
